**SUBJECT: Guidelines for the Completion and Turn Over of Remaining Road Board Projects**

Pursuant to Section 7 of Republic Act No. 11239, otherwise known as "*An act abolishing the Road Board and Providing for the Disposition of the Motor Vehicle User's Charge Collections, Amending for the Purpose Republic Act No. 8794, Entitled 'An Act Imposing a Motor Vehicle user's Charge on Owners of All Types of Motor Vehicles and for Other Purposes'*" which transfers the rights, assets and liabilities of the Road Board to the DPWH, the following guidelines are hereby prescribed to establish the procedures for the completion and turnover of the remaining Road Board projects.

**I. Scope and Coverage**

These guidelines shall apply to all the remaining goods, infrastructure projects and consulting services contracts, attached herein **(Annex "1")**, which were previously implemented by the Road Board that were transferred to the DPWH upon the effectivity of RA No. 11239.

**II. Establishment of Interim Implementing Unit (IIU)**

The Bureau of Construction, DPWH Regional Offices in NCR, Regions VII and VIII shall be designated as the IIU for the respective road board projects based on its location as per **Annex "2"**. The designated IIU shall be responsible in closing out the remaining road board projects and perform the necessary procedures whether the particular project is due for completion or termination.

**III. General Guidelines**

**a. Turn Over of Contract Documents and Inventory of Works**

Within thirty (30) days upon effectivity of this Order, all relevant records/ documents pertaining to the projects covered by this Order shall be catalogued **(Annex "3")** and officially turned over by the authorized former Road Board Secretariat absorbed by the DPWH **(Annex "4")** to the concerned IIU. For records/documents which were forwarded to the DPWH Central Records, the said authorized Road Board Secretariat shall retrieve the same and similarly catalogue and officially turn over to the concerned IIU.

Upon receipt of all relevant records/ documents of the projects covered by this Order, the concerned IIU shall coordinate with the concerned contractor and the authorized former Road Board Secretariat and form an Inspectorate Team

to perform a joint inventory of the actual accomplishments of the concerned contractors in their respective projects preparatory to the issuance of Work Resumption Order. A joint inventory report shall be prepared upon completion of said inventory and shall be submitted to the Head of IIU for approval, copy furnished the chairman of the DPWH Turn Over Committee for information and reference.

In the event that contractor/s, consultant/s or supplier/s are no longer capable to push through with the completion of their respective projects, the IIU shall proceed with the termination of contract subject to the guidelines and procedures stipulated under the provisions of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA 9184.

**b. Payments**

All payments of work accomplished, as recommended by the respective IIU, shall be made in the Central Office, pursuant to the existing payment guidelines and policies of the Department, subject to the usual accounting and auditing procedures and policies.

**c. Monitoring**

The IIU shall submit a monthly accomplishment report, every 25<sup>th</sup> of the month, to the Chairman of the Central Office Turn Over Committee as per D.O. no. 35, series of 2019 starting from the effectivity of this Order until the issuance of Certificate of Completion or Notice of Termination, as the case may be.

**d. Turn Over and Acceptance**

Official turn over to the respective end-users (DPWH District Engineering Offices or LGUs), shall be facilitated by the IIU upon issuance of Certificate of Completion. The IIU shall likewise responsible for the issuance of Certificate of Acceptance after the Defects Liability Period pursuant to the existing guidelines and policies of the Department. Maintenance of turned over projects shall be the responsibility of the respective end-user.

This Order shall take effect immediately.

[ REPUBLIC ACT NO. **11239** ]

AN ACT ABOLISHING THE ROAD BOARD AND PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S CHARGE COLLECTIONS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8794, ENTITLED "AN ACT IMPOSING A MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S CHARGE ON OWNERS OF ALL TYPES OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

SECTION 1. Section 7 of Republic Act No. 8794 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 7. *Disposition of Monies Collected.* - All monies collected under this Act shall be remitted to the National Treasury under a special account in the General Fund to be earmarked solely for the

construction, upgrading, repair, and rehabilitation of roads, bridges, and road drainage to be included in the annual General Appropriations Act."

SEC. 2. Section 8 of the same Act is hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. Section 9 of the same Act is hereby renumbered as Section 8 and amended to read as follows:

*"SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations.*

– The secretaries of the DBM, DPWH, and the DOTr, shall jointly, within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, and any amendments thereto, promulgate the rules and regulations to implement and carry out the intent, objectives, purposes, and provisions of this Act, as amended, including such structural and procedural improvements in the systems and agencies concerned as may be necessary to ensure the prudent, wise, effective, and efficient utilization of the special funds established under this Act, as amended."

SEC. 4. The succeeding sections of the same Act are hereby renumbered accordingly.

SEC. 5. *Abolition of the Road Board.* – The Road Board created by Republic Act No. 8794 is hereby abolished.

SEC. 6. *Absorption of Affected Personnel, Separation and Retirement Benefits.* – The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) shall, as needed, absorb the employees of the secretariat of the abolished Road Board, without diminution of their salaries and other benefits. Employees who are separated from the service as a result of the abolition of the Road Board and its secretariat shall receive separation benefits under the provisions of Republic Act No. 6656: *Provided*, That those who are qualified to retire under existing laws shall be allowed to retire and receive retirement benefits to which they may be entitled under applicable laws, rules and regulations.

SEC. 7. *Transfer of Rights, Assets, and Liabilities.* – The DPWH shall, by virtue of this Act, be subrogated to all the rights and assume all the obligations and liabilities of the Road Board, and all records, property, assets, equipment, and funds of the Road Board, including unexpended appropriations or allocations, shall be transferred to the DPWH.


SEC. 8. *Congressional Oversight Committee.* – There is hereby created a Congressional Oversight Committee to monitor the implementation of Republic Act No. 8794, as amended, and the use of the special funds established therein. The Committee shall be composed of five (5) Members of the House of Representatives and five (5) Senators to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate, respectively: *Provided*, That one (1) Member of the House of Representatives and one (1) Senator shall come from the Minority of each House of Congress. The Committee shall be jointly chaired by a Member of the House of Representatives and a Senator designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate, respectively.

SEC. 9. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision or part of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining parts or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 10. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 11. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.



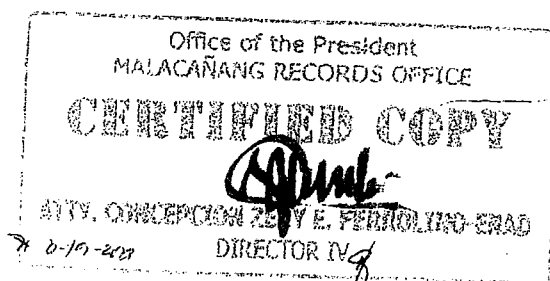
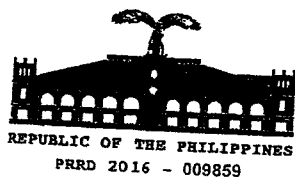

IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11239,  
OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT ABOLISHING THE ROAD BOARD AND  
PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S  
CHARGE COLLECTION", AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT  
NO. 8794, ENTITLED "AN ACT IMPOSING A MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S  
CHARGE ON OWNERS OF ALL TYPES OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND FOR  
OTHER PURPOSES"

The following Implementing Rules and Regulations are hereby prescribed pursuant to Section 3 of Republic Act No. 11239 to carry out the provisions of the said Act.

**Section 1. Coverage.** These Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) shall cover the *a) disposition of monies collected under and by virtue of RA 8794, (b) absorption of affected personnel, separation and retirement benefits, and (c) transfer of rights, assets and liabilities of the Road Board which was abolished by virtue of RA 11239.*

**Section 2. Definition of Terms.**

- (a) Roads - A public way for purposes of vehicular traffic, which is within the mandate of DPWH, including the entire area within the road right-of-way, which have been classified as such through laws, ordinances, executive orders, proclamations and department orders.
  - (b) Bridges - A structure carrying a pathway or roadway over a depression or obstacle. A structure built from stone or wood erected over a river, creek, stream, ditch, ravine or any other place, to facilitate the passage of motorized vehicles.
  - (c) Road Drainage - Open ditch or conduit designed to allow the passage of water from one point to another in a certain direction, whether for purposes of drainage or irrigation.
  - (d) Construction - The act or process of building roads, bridges and road drainage, consistent with the purpose of Motor Vehicle User's Charge (MVUC).
  - (e) Upgrading - A grouping of types of work that involve improvement or change in surface type, number of lanes of roads, raising of elevation and increasing the number of lanes of bridges and road drainage, including its component of road safety such as pedestrian walk-way, lighting; and other works necessary for asset preservation.
  - (f) Repair - Reactive, simple, small scale activity to mend a minor damaged portion of an asset to a good or sound condition comparable to that before the damaged occurred. For example, pothole patching, sealing of cracks, replacement of broken minor equipment parts.
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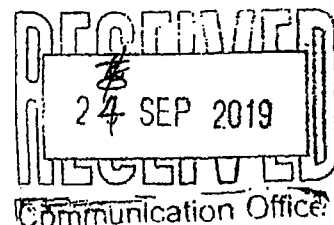

- (g) Rehabilitation -- A grouping of types of work which restore structural capacity and performance and/or enhance safety. These types of work are applicable to infrastructure in poor and bad condition. In the case of pavement, this shall not extend into the subgrade.
- (h) Non-Diminution of Salaries and other Benefits - Prohibition on employers from eliminating or reducing the benefits regularly received by their employees pursuant to a law authorizing such benefits.

**Section 3. Disposition of Monies Collected.** All monies collected by virtue of RA 8794 and deposited under the four (4) special trust accounts in the National Treasury, namely: (1) Special Road Support Fund, (2) Special Local Road Fund, (3) Special Road Safety Fund, and (4) Special Vehicle Pollution Control Fund, shall be automatically credited to a Special Account in the General Fund constituted as the Special Road Fund, and shall be earmarked solely for the construction, upgrading, repair and rehabilitation of roads, bridges and road drainage to be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

The Secretary of DPWH, through a Department Order, shall provide the necessary guidelines for vetting and evaluation process of projects, consistent with R.A. 11239 and these implementing rules and regulations.

**Section 4. Abolition of the Road Board and Transition of Road Board Functions to DPWH; Allocation of Funds for the Purpose.** The Road Board is hereby abolished, and the transition period for the transfer of rights, assets and liabilities from the Road Board to the DPWH, which includes the inventory of any and all documentation relative to the operation of the Road Board, shall be made within six (6) months from the effectivity of RA 11239.

Any and all allocation obligated before the abolition of the Road Board shall be utilized by the said agency to settle all its obligation (i.e. salaries of employees, office space rental, utilities and the like), subject to the usual accounting rules and regulations. The DPWH will ask the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) for funding to cover the expenses incurred during this period of transition. The allocation shall be utilized by the Road Board to settle all obligations for the same period.

**Section 5. Absorption of Affected Personnel and Retirement Benefits.** The DPWH shall, as needed, absorb the employees of the Secretariat of the abolished Road Board, without diminution of salaries and other benefits, in accordance with the guidelines to be issued by DPWH pursuant to Civil Service Rules.

Employees who are separated from the service as a result of the abolition of the Road Board and its Secretariat shall receive separation benefits under the provisions of Republic Act No. 6656, Provided That, those who are qualified to retire under existing laws shall be allowed to retire and shall receive retirement benefits to which they may be entitled under applicable laws, rules and regulations.

DPWH shall submit to the DBM the corresponding organizational and staffing modifications as a result of the abolition of the Road Board and its Secretariat, for the DBM's evaluation and approval.

**Section 6. Transfer of Rights, Assets, and Liabilities.** The DPWH shall be subrogated to all the rights and assume all the obligations and liabilities of the Road Board.

Any and all documentation relating to the function, duty, and operation of the Road Board, including but not limited to the minutes of the board, their resolutions, secretary's certificate and all evidence of expenditure and accounting shall be turned over to the DPWH.

The Road Board books of accounts shall be transferred to the DPWH subject to Accounting and Auditing rules and regulations.

Any and all equipment owned by the Road Board shall be transferred in favor of DPWH, including but not limited to, office furnishings; computer hardware, software, their operating systems and programs; vehicles and their tools for maintenance.

All unexpended appropriations and monies collected by virtue of R.A. No. 8794 and amassed in four (4) special trust accounts in the National Treasury, namely: (1) Special Road Support Fund; (2) Special Local Road Fund; (3) Special Road Safety Fund; and (4) Special Vehicle Pollution Control Fund shall be transferred in favor of and under the management of DPWH.

**Section 7. Congressional Oversight Committee.** There is hereby created a Congressional Oversight Committee to monitor the Implementation of Republic Act No. 8794, as amended, and the use of the special funds established therein to obtain information relevant therefor, in accordance with Section 22, Article VI of the Constitution and applicable jurisprudence. The Committee shall be composed of five (5) Members of the House of Representatives and five (5) Senators to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate, respectively: *Provided*, That one (1) Member of the House of Representatives and one (1) Senator shall come from the Minority of each House of Congress. The Committee shall be jointly chaired by a Member of the House of Representatives and a Senator designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate, respectively.

**Section 8. Transitory Provision.** All projects previously approved by the Road Board but was not funded by the DBM shall be subject to the evaluation and monitoring procedure to be formulated and implemented by the DPWH.

**Section 9. Separability Clause.** If any provision or part of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining parts or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 10. Repealing Clause.** Any issuances, orders, proclamations, rules or regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

**Section 11. Effectivity.** These IRR shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.

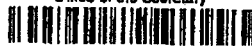

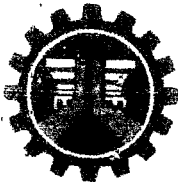

In line with the enactment of Republic Act No. 11239, otherwise known as "An Act Abolishing the Road Board and Providing for the Disposition of the Motor Vehicle User's Charge Collections, Amending for the Purpose Republic Act No. 8794, Entitled 'An Act Imposing a Motor Vehicle User's Charge on Owners of All Types of Motor Vehicles and for Other Purposes", a DPWH Turn Over Committee is hereby created.

The Central Office Turn Over Committee shall be composed of the following:

The primary functions of this Committee shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

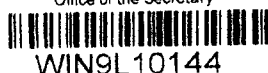
1. Prepare Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) for RA 11239, consistent with Section 3 thereof;
2. Evaluate the position description of the existing permanent positions of the secretariat of the Road Board; recommend, if necessary, the absorption of these employees, and determine the particular office to which the said employees shall be allocated;
3. Coordinate and facilitate the transfer of all records, property, assets, equipment and funds of the Road Board, including unexpended appropriations or allocations;
4. Create the necessary technical working group and assign specific duties to its members; and
5. Such other functions which are necessary to carry out the provisions of RA 11239, as may be determined by the DPWH Secretary.

The Committee may call on other officials and employees to assist in the execution of its functions.
