
SUBJECT: Placing the Administrative and Manpower Management Service, Internal Audit Service, and Monitoring and Information Service Under the Immediate Supervision and Control of the Undersecretary for Administration and Finance

In view of the reduction in the number of Assistant Secretaries under the General Appropriations Act for FY 1991, and the acceptance of the resignations from office of Assistant Secretaries Carolina Z. Mangawang, Danilo Aquino and Rodolfo Rosales effective 01 August 1991, the following realignments in supervision structure are hereby effected:

1. The Internal Audit Service, the Monitoring and Information Service, and the Administrative and Manpower Management Service except the Personnel Division and the Supply and Property Management Division thereat, are hereby placed under the immediate supervision and control of Undersecretary GREGORIO S. ALVAREZ.
2. The Personnel Division, and the Supply and Property Management Division, Administrative and Manpower Management Service, shall continue to be under the supervision and control of Assistant Secretary BIENVENIDO E. MERELOS.

The Chiefs of the Administrative and Manpower Management Service, Monitoring and Information Service, and Internal Audit Service (Directors III) shall continue to exercise immediate supervision and control over the Divisions/organizational units under their respective Services, and shall continue to discharge the functions and responsibilities appurtenant to their respective positions, and exercise the authorities and powers vested in them as Department Service Chiefs.

This Department Order is issued pursuant to Sections 6 and 7(4), Chapter 2, Book IV of Executive Order No. 292, otherwise known as the Administrative Code of 1987, and shall take effect immediately.
