SUBJECT: CREATION OF THE ASSESSMENT

TEAM FOR THE PROPOSAL TO TRANSFER METRO MANILA FLOOD CONTROL AND SEWER MANAGEMENT

FROM MMDA TO THE DPWH

An **Assessment Team** is hereby created to lead the assessment and evaluation of existing flood control structures/facilities, that include EFCOS, pumping stations, drainage mains and drainage channels, etc.; identify priority projects for immediate implementation; and to serve as the focal group who will coordinate with the Metropolitan Manila and Development Authority (MMDA) for the inventory of equipment and facilities, assets and liabilities, personnel and other related documents necessary to assess the proposed transfer of flood control and sewer management from the MMDA to the DPWH.

The Assessment Team shall be represented by senior officials from this Department who are directly involved in the flood management and operation, to wit:

The following scope of works will be undertaken by the Assessment Team, to wit:

- Coordinate with the MMDA regarding information and data relative to budgetary allocations and expenditures for the operation and maintenance of existing flood control equipment, structures and related facilities, including salaries, wages, benefits, etc. of employees that will be affected by the proposed turn-over;
- Make an inventory/audit of personnel involved in the flood control operations in coordination with the Administrative Division of the MMDA;
- Conduct an inventory and inspection of all equipment and facilities to be transferred by the MMDA together with the records of these items such as acquisition cost, date of acquisition, status/nature and condition of equipment, service and other vehicles, and its locations/whereabouts;
- Make a complete inventory of utilities in use by the MMDA; such as but not limited to electricity, telephone and water;
- Request MMDA for the copies of all existing contracts for the maintenance of flood control, equipment and facilities including but not limited to security, maintenance and the like:
- Recommend priority projects for immediate implementation in due consideration of the results/findings of the World Bank – Assisted Master Plan Study being undertaken by the Department;
- Prepare a summary assessment report on the above activities that will be undertaken in connection with the proposal to transfer to DPWH.

This order shall take effect immediately.
