

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) made and entered into this _____ in _____, between and among:

The **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS** (DPWH), a National Government Agency existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines, with principal office address at Bonifacio Drive Port Area, Manila, represented by its Undersecretary, **EMIL K. SADAIN, CESO I**, hereinafter referred to as the “**DPWH**”.

- and -

The **LAND BANK OF THE PHILIPPINES** (LBP), a government financial institution (GFI) created and existing under and by virtue of the provisions of RA No. 3844, as amended, with principal office address at _____, Intramuros, Manila, represented by its Bank Manager, **NARDO M. MASA**, hereinafter referred to as the “**LBP**”.

WITNESS THAT:

WHEREAS, the Philippine Government through the DPWH has embarked upon a program of development and implementation of the Metro Manila Flood Management Project (MMFMP) herein referred as the “Project”, jointly funded by International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (“World Bank”) and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) with Government of the Philippines (GOP) counterpart funding, and composed of four (4) components namely, (i) Modernizing Drainage Areas, (ii) Minimizing Solid Waste in Waterways, (iii) Participatory Housing and Resettlement, and (iv) Project Management and Coordination.

WHEREAS, DPWH is implementing Component 1 of the project which aims to modernize the existing drainage area by rehabilitating and upgrading an estimated 36 existing pumping station and construction of 20 new pumping stations. The project is following a programmatic approach and the 56 drainage areas have been selected based on a set of technical, economic, and social criteria.

WHEREAS, LBP is a GFI created under RA No. 3844. It is a full service universal bank with a unique social mandate of being a catalyst of progress in the countryside while sustaining commercial viability.

WHEREAS, the LBP supports the disbursement of funds to the 229 Informal Settlers Families (ISFs) beneficiaries to be relocated in Trece Martires, Cavite under the National Housing Authority (NHA) relocation site and for the succeeding disbursement of funds to the ISFs to be identified under the Batch 3, Batch 4, and new pumping stations.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties hereby agree as follows:

I. **APPLICABILITY**

- a. This shall govern the digital disbursement of the financial assistance to the ISFs living along the technical footprints of 36 existing pumping stations and

20 new pumping stations within Metro Manila to be resettled in respective relocation sites.

II. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

A. DPWH shall:

1. Provide the final masterlist of ISFs to be relocated, identified, and validated who are qualified to receive the financial assistance;
2. Collect the information of ISFs that will be used as basis for the certified masterlist that will be transmitted to the LBP; the list should show which beneficiaries have mobile phone numbers and those without;
3. Forward to the LBP the certified payroll documents following the agreed format/s, amounts to be disbursed per ISFs;
4. Through its designated signatories, authorize and instruct LBP to deposit the corresponding amounts as indicated in the payroll documents directly into the ISFs' LBP bank accounts;
5. Receive the details of liquidation documents and handle reconciliation of the list of beneficiaries with successful and unsuccessful credits; and
6. Communicate to the beneficiaries that they will be receiving financial assistance.

B. LBP shall:

1. Act as DPWH's administrator in the electronic payment and distribution of financial assistance to the ISFs affected by the Project;
2. Receive from DPWH the payroll documents in the agreed format and with complete data, including the amounts to be credited to beneficiaries;
3. Execute the crediting of the financial assistance of the ISFs into their respective LBP bank accounts based on the instruction and payroll documents provided by DPWH within twenty-four (24) hours from receipt of payroll documents; and
4. Submit to DPWH a report on the disbursement of the program funds, including summary of unsuccessful credits.

III. WARRANTIES

Each Party represents and warrants that: (a) it has the right, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement and to fully perform its obligations stated herein; (b) to exert all efforts and means, in collaboration with the other parties, to deliver the financial assistance to all eligible ISFs; (c) it shall comply with the Data Privacy Act of 2012, the Data Sharing Agreement relative to this Agreement and its data privacy policy; (d) it shall not engage in fraud or deceptive, misleading, unethical or unfair competition practices; (e) it shall not act in any manner which conflicts or interferes with any existing material commitment or obligation of such Party's performance of its material obligations under this agreement; and (f) it shall perform in compliance

with all applicable laws and rules and regulations of the relevant government authority.

IV. LIABILITIES

Each party shall keep the other free and harmless, and indemnify the other from third party claims, suits, or demands which are due to negligent or fraudulent acts or omissions or willful misconduct solely attributable to one but not the other.

In case of any intentional or unintentional harm, injury or wrong done by one party to another party herein, in violation of the conditions, covenants, stipulations or terms stated hereunder, the aggrieved party may resort to any appropriate action, permitted under the law, to seek redress to the harm, injury or wrong committed, without prejudice to the parties' continuing adherence to and performance of their respective commitments and obligations.

V. CONFIDENTIALITY

Any information, of whatever nature and form, acquired pursuant to this MOA shall be confidential. Any document obtained, or information derived therefrom, shall not be used for purposes other than those stated in the MOA. Likewise, neither Party shall make public use of any confidential information without the prior written consent of the approving authorities of the Party from where the information originated. The Parties shall assert all legal exemptions and privileges on each other's behalf as are necessary to ensure the confidentiality of all information acquired under the MOA.

For purposes of this provision, Confidential Information means any and all information disclosed by a party (Disclosing Party) to, or obtained by, the other Party (Receiving Party) in any manner, that, as a result of, or in connection with this MOA, by its nature, is considered proprietary and confidential, regardless of whether such information is specifically labeled or described as such including, but not limited to, proprietary information, personal data, financial data, business plans or proposals, agreements of the Disclosing Party with third parties, and any representation by any officer, employee or representative of the Disclosing Party. Provided, however, that Confidential Information shall not include the:

- Information that is generally available to the public other than as result of disclosure in violation of this MOA;
- Information available to the Receiving Party on non-confidential basis without an express restriction on disclosure;
- Information which is required to be disclosed by any court, tribunal or regulatory authority or by any requirement of law, legal process or regulation; or
- Information that the Disclosing Party expressly agrees in writing may be disclosed by the Receiving Party to third parties.

The Receiving Party agrees that Confidential Information shall not be disclosed to third parties without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party, and that each Party shall exercise the same degree of care as it applies to protect its own confidential information of similar nature that it does not desire to publish, disclose, or disseminate. This obligation of confidentiality shall continue in full force and effect notwithstanding the termination of this Agreement.

Any and all information, including the Disbursement Process that has been specifically identified as being proprietary, confidential and exclusive shall remain strictly confidential between DPWH and LBP.

VI. NOTICES AND CORRESPONDENCES

Except as otherwise provided in this MOA, any notice, demand, letter, or communication shall be in writing and may be sent by one party to the other by electronic mail, web-based uploads, or other electronic or teleprocess instruction system, post, reputable courier, confirmed facsimile, or hand.

Any notice, demand, letter or communication from one party to the other shall be effective only when received by the designated addressee/s. Any notice, demand, letter, or communication may be sent by one party to the other at the address and numbers set out under this MOA or such address and numbers as one party may inform the other in writing.

All notices shall be deemed to have been personally given on the date of receipt (if delivered personally), or ten (10) calendar days after posting (if transmitted by registered mail), or the date of transmission (if transmitted by telefax or electronic mail), or the date of receipt (if sent through other means). Each party may change its addressee, address, telefax number, or email address for purposes of receiving notice by giving written notice thereof to the other parties hereto.

VII. TERMINATION

The agreement will be terminated after the completion of the project provision of assistance to the ISFs along the waterways affected by the Project.

VIII. AMENDMENTS

In the implementation of the MOA, the parties may introduce modifications through the amendments of its specific provisions as the need arises.

IX. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

In case any provision hereof be declared void or unenforceable by competent authorities, the provision/s unaffected by such declaration shall remain valid and binding among the parties, their successors and assigns.

X. EFFECTIVITY

This MOA shall take effect upon signing of the parties and shall remain in full force and effect until the completion of the delivery of financial assistance to identified ISFs, including the liquidation thereof.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement entered into this _____ day of _____, 2022 by and between:

The **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS**, a National Government Agency existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines, with principal office address at Bonifacio Drive Port Area, Manila, represented by its Undersecretary, **EMIL K. SADAIN, CESO I**, hereinafter referred to as the "**DPWH**";

- AND -

THE CITY OF MANILA, a government agency duly organized under and by virtue of the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office address at Office of the Mayor, Manila City Hall, Taft Avenue, Manila, represented herein by its City Mayor, **HON. FRANCISCO "ISKO MORENO" DOMAGOSO**, herein referred to as the "**SENDING LGU**";

- WITNESSETH THAT -

WHEREAS, the Philippine Government through the DPWH has embarked upon a program of development and implementation of the Metro Manila Flood Management Project (MMFMP) herein referred as the "Project", jointly funded by International Bank for Reconstruction and Development ("World Bank") and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) with Government of the Philippines (GOP) counterpart funding, and composed of four (4) components namely, (i) Modernizing Drainage Areas, (ii) Minimizing Solid Waste in Waterways, (iii) Participatory Housing and Resettlement, and (iv) Project Management and Coordination;

WHEREAS, DPWH is implementing Component 1 of the Project which aims to modernize the existing drainage area by rehabilitating and upgrading an estimated 36 existing pumping stations and construction of 20 new pumping stations. The Project is following a programmatic approach and the 56 drainage areas have been selected based on a set of technical, economic, and social criteria;

WHEREAS, DPWH has the overall responsibility for the implementation of Component 3 of the Project with the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) and Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) providing oversight responsibility along with DPWH. Specifically, the National Housing Authority (NHA) will be in charge of (i) presenting all available resettlement options to Project Affected People (PAPs); (ii) land acquisition; (iii) housing and site development; (iv) contracting service providers for social preparation and resettlement activities and technical studies as needed; and (v) engaging service providers to implement livelihood support activities for PAPs;

WHEREAS, the RA 11201 dated 14 February 2019 creating DHSUD as the overall oversight agency of all the Key Shelter Agency (KSA), which in the said RA section 50, an EO 90 was released placing NHA as under the supervision of DHSUD providing the project relocation site for the 229 Informal Settlers Families (ISFs) living along the technical footprints of Vitas Pumping Station;

WHEREAS, the NHA provided 229 units located in Summer Homes relocation site in Brgy. Cabuco, Trece Martires, Cavite with an average lot size of 40 sq.m. and average floor size of 22 sq.m. amounting of P240,000.00 payable of PAH for a maximum of 30 years;

WHEREAS, the NHA units are equipped with electrical connections prior to transfer and occupancy, and supply of water system through the elevated tanks and, when fully operational, provide individual connections;

WHEREAS, each housing unit is a typical one-bedroom unit with toilet and bath, kitchen sink and an outdoor multi-purpose work area per unit;

WHEREAS, the Trece Martires, Cavite as the receiving LGU, supports the relocation of 229 ISFs in the aforementioned property which is within its area of jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Unit of Trece Martires, Cavite, a government agency duly organized under and by virtue of the laws of the Republic of the Philippines with office address at the City Hall Building, Trece Martires City, Cavite represented herein by its City Mayor, **HON. GEMMA B. LUBIGAN**, herein referred to as the **“RECEIVING LGU”**, to accept the relocatees in Brgy. 93 and 150, Vitas, Tondo, Manila;

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to transfer the fund in the amount of Php 20,000.00, from the DPWH to City of Manila to implement the project, in accordance to COA Circular No. 2017-002 dated October 25, 2017, which states that the Auditor of the Implementing Agency (DPWH) shall no longer be required to issue a certification on the post-audit of the Report of Checks issues and Report of Disbursement under the Item 3.1.1 of COA Circular No. 2012-001, shall no longer required to issue a corresponding Credit Notice as a prerequisite for the liquidation of the cash advance under Item 3.1.3 of COA Circular No. 2012-001, and shall furnish the Accountant and the Auditor of the Source Agency, Notices of Disallowance, and subsequent audit decisions issues, if any, on the results of audit of disbursement of the cash advance, for reference and recognition in the books of accounts, to restore accountability of the IA upon finality of the audit decisions.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and the terms and conditions herein set forth, the PARTIES hereby agree, as follows;

Section 1. Rights and Obligation of DPWH

- a. Transfer the amount of Php 20,000.00 to the city of Manila, to implement the said Project, in accordance to COA Circular No. 2017- 002 dated 25 October 2017 in relation to paragraphs 3.1.1 and 3.1.3 of COA Circular No. 2012- 001 dated 14 June 2012. The amount shall be deposited to Trust Fund Account No. _____ pursuant to Section 63 Disbursement for IATF of CAO Circular No. 2015- 007;
- b. Record the issuance, and liquidation and all documents in relation to the fund transfer in accordance with COA Circular No. 94- 013, Item 3.0 of COA Circular 2012- 001, COA Circular No. 2016- 002, and COA Circular 2017- 002 dated 13 December 1994, 14 June 2012, 31 May 2016, and 25 October 2017, respectively, and relevant government accounting and auditing rules and regulation. Carry out implementation of regular monitoring and ensure that resettlement activities are undertaken in accordance with applicable government laws and regulations and the social safeguards policies of World Bank;
- c. Coordinate with NHA, SENDING LGU and RECEIVING LGU on areas for clearing with a corresponding schedule vis-à-vis the Project's implementation schedule. Pursuant to Item 5 of COA Circular No. 94-013, perform the following:
 1. Obligate the allotment for the Project to be implemented based on the advice of allotment and/or memorandum of agreement or similar documents;
 2. Issue a check in the name of City of Manila;
 3. Require the City of Manila to issue official receipt acknowledging receipt of fund transferred;

4. Maintain a subsidiary ledger of the cash transferred pertaining to the Project;
 5. Require the LGU to submit the reports and furnish the DPWH with a copy of the journal voucher taking up the expenditures;
 6. Issue a certification by the Accountant that funds previously transferred to City of Manila has been liquidated and accounted for in the book; and
 7. Issue the official receipt for the unexpended balance remitted by the City of Manila
- d. Provide Sending LGU PPEs Sanitation Kit;

Section 2. Rights and Obligations of the RECEIVING LGU

- a. Assist and closely coordinate with the DPWH, NHA, and SENDING LGU in the supervision of the RAP implementation;
- b. Construct the basic services facilities within the relocation site; and
- c. Assist in the implementation of livelihood restoration and implementation program which includes but not limited to skills training, provisions of capital and organization of cooperative.

Section 3. Rights and Obligations of the SENDING LGU

- a. Issue an Official Receipt/acknowledging receipt of the deposit in its Trust Fund account with account no. _____, and record in the book of accounts of the LGU the fund transferred to it by the DPWH in accordance with the existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations;
- b. Coordinate with Public Employment Service Office (PESO), City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO), and/or Urban Poor Affairs Office (UPAO) to conduct a social preparation orientation for relocatees;
- c. Assist and closely coordinate with the RECEIVING LGU in the supervision of the RAP implementation;
- d. Do such other acts and deeds that will facilitate the Project implementation. Liquidate, without delay, to the DPWH, the amount transferred in accordance with existing accounting and audit laws, rules and regulations;
- e. Submit to the DPWH, liquidation reports together with pertinent supporting documents, pursuant to the period and requirements prescribed under COA Circular No. 2015-007 dated 22 October 2015; and
- f. Submit recording of receipt/utilization and liquidation including the documentation of money/cash transfer by the DPWH in accordance with the rules and regulation embodied in COA Circular No. 94-013, 2021-001 and 2016-002 dated 13 December 1194, 4 June 2012 and 31 May 2016, respectively.

Section 4. Effectivity

This Memorandum of Agreement shall commence in _____ 2022.

Section 5. Capacity and Authorization

The **PARTIES** therein warrant that they have the capacity, power, and the requisite authorization to enter in this Agreement and to perform their respective obligations herein enumerated.

The **PARTIES** agree to sign, execute and deliver such other agreement and document in furtherance of and in the implementation of this Agreement; and

This shall be binding upon the **PARTIES** and their respective successors-in-interests and assigns. All other terms and conditions subsequently agreed upon by the **PARTIES** in writing after the signing of this MOA shall constitute an addendum thereto and form an integral part thereof.

Section 6. Separability Clause:

Should any part of this agreement be judicially declared null and void, such nullity shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions hereof.

She added that the updated profile will be sent. Comments and Additions

ISFs Master List

- Ms. Luz Evangelista (LE) clarified that the 229 ISFs are from the list coming from DPWH, which they have conducted. This list is from the 2017 census which was validated in 2019.
- While the total ISFs in Estero de Vitas is 1,738, the identified number above only comprise of ISFs who are and will be affected by the Rehabilitation of the Vitas Pumping Station.
- From the 229 DPWH census, only 163 are officially under the National Housing Authority (NHA) Masterlist. Thus, this would mean that the rest would be subjected under BSAAC.
- LE further emphasized that only those under NHA census will be considered because these ISFs

	<p>were done through the LIAC. Technically, those in excess of 163 are considered UNCENSUS as far as NHA is concerned and are subject for BSAAC as requested for inclusion.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LE also added from the 163 ISFs, there are 24 ISFs that needs to undergo BSAAC due to changes in their status, among others.

If this is done together with the LIAC? She further added that consultations should be conducted in 3 consecutive events and participated by NHA, PCUP, Commission on Human Rights (CHR) and the LGU. She asked if these were observed? <p>Response: At Barangay 93 by DPWH. The LIAC, through the Urban Settlement Office (USO), were invited in the social preparation activities as well as in the proceedings of the activities.</p>	
	Importance of Inter-Agency Participation and Presence in Resettlement Activities <ul style="list-style-type: none">• MGA further emphasized that in the previous Executive Meetings, it was agreed that LIAC should be participating in the consultations. To level off, she provided the rationale for the participation of agencies, particularly PCUP which is covered by Executive Orders (EOs) 82 and 69 that expanded its role not only to monitor the situation of the ISFs but the quality of processes by the	

implementing agencies especially if this is forced relocation.

- Dialogues are important. If there are discussions conducted in the first meeting where other agencies are not present, there should be another meeting to give an opportunity to share the information.
- While PCUP may not be able to attend most of the activities, it is important that they are aware of the activities happening on the ground, so they can effectively defend the project/activity if there will be complaints in the future. They want to ensure that all the information and the processes have been properly discussed and disseminated to the ISFs.
- The CHR representative added the importance of compliance with the law and the procedures. While it is costly, these are agency mandates. Like CHR, they abide and respect the international treaty and other international obligations in which the Philippines is a signatory. For our agency, we look into the rule of law, the right to be heard. Is there a due process?
- While CHR do not have a role in the actual eviction during relocation, their presence is important as part of the compliance to the policy. Similar to NHA which has its own process and standards articulated in the code of policy.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Let us be guided by the policy and ensure compliance to the procedures as partners. They encourage everyone to work together in giving good services for the community. • MGA added that this is the reason why she always emphasized the presence of LIAC in every meeting and activity. For the project to move forward and be successful, the presence of LIAC is necessary, especially for Certificate of Compliance (COC) if and when there are families that will resist. • Recognizing the limitations from all sides, MGA takes this as an opportunity to correct the misunderstandings, mistakes, and deficiencies in the processes and coordination. There is still time according to her. The group can still proceed and follow the procedures set by the Urban Development and Housing Act (UDHA) by working and doing it together with the presence of LIAC. <p>Relocation and Resettlement Action Plan (RRAP)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LE inquired if Manila has a Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) for Vitas Pumping Station. <p>Response 1. JPS answered that the project adopted the RRAP on Waterways as agreed before.</p> <p>Response 2. The priority of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) does not include Estero de Vitas and thus, the RRAP on Waterways</p>	
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will not be relevant in this regard.

- LE stated that it is not too late. We can still prepare the EO as well as to schedule the RRAP. Actually, the documents are drafted and we can use the workshop to complete these documents. This is for our safety, if and when there will be complaints from the beneficiaries/relocatees, the RRAP will be required from the LIAC.
- CHR representative further added that this move will provide legal protection with respect to our efforts to comply because it is documented. We want a situation that all of us are involved and are supporting one another based on the agreements to avoid conflict.

Request for a RRAP Workshop

- LE further pointed out the responsiveness of the Project. She expressed her appreciation on the various entitlements accorded to the ISF beneficiaries and further emphasized that the Project is covered by a MOA signed by the LGU of Manila, LGU Trece Martires, and NHA.
- LE requested to schedule a RRAP workshop to put everything in place on May 18-20, 2022. The recommendation is to conduct this immediately after election and prioritize this among a number of activities that the other agencies have.

She directly addressed DPWH and DOHWA to consider this request. The RRAP workshop is normally designed for 3 days and 2 nights.

- All recommendations and comments raised during this meeting will be considered and further discussed after holy week. To plot the schedules, all will be coordinated with Ms. Beatrice Gay Dy Fenomeno (BGDF) from USO.
- Other members of the team also suggested to set virtual meetings for the preparatory activities and for plotting the schedules if possible.
- BGDF added, “in fairness with the Project, the group is regularly coordinating with the Urban Settlements Office. Our target is the Executive Order duly signed by the mayor identifying the members of the LIAC.”
- During the workshop, LIAC will provide/formulate the resolution for BSAAC as well as prepare the code of policy for those who will be considered ISFs.
- Prior to the RRAP, USO will draft an EO and provide a copy of the draft multi-party MOA. USO will disseminate the draft multi-party MOA to partners, even if this is not yet signed by the GM, in order for the different agencies who will form the LIAC to understand the provisions contained in the document.

- NHA solicited the commitment of the participating agencies on the schedule of RRAP which is set on May 18-20, 2022 and further requested DPWH/DOWHA to determine the venue and provide the budget for the said activity.

Metro Manila Flood Control Project Component 3 Social Preparation as a Special Case

- CHR pointed out that collectively the social preparation phase is the responsibility of NHA as the lead.
- However, LE refuted this, stating that this project is a special case. She informed everyone that for this project, the entitlements are direct from the proponent (DPWH) to the beneficiaries and the receiving LGU. The sending NHA is technically for the issuance of entry pass as part of the LIAC.

Request to Proceed with the April 29, 2022 Relocation of 2nd Batch.

- Ms. Cecille Isubal (CI) raised her request for the team to consider and approve the second batch of ISF relocation this April 29, 2022, as the preparation is underway, instead of conducting this after the RRAP Workshop. She further added that for the necessary preparations, the team will work backwards from the date of the relocation to ensure

the documents, requirements, as well as processes, are complied.

- LE generated the approval of the LIAC members/team regarding this request since the relocatees are willing and interested to be relocated at Trece Martires, Cavite.
- The group agreed that this would be the last relocation before the RRAP, DPWH/DOWHA secured the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) or Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) exemption and forwarded to the LGU, and conducted the final briefing on April 28, 2022 at the barangay covered court.

COC and Entitlements for Disqualified Beneficiaries

- If there are resisting ISFs from the 229 ISFs, they will be subject to COC.
- Furthermore, for those not included in the census, they will likely be disqualified as per agreement with BSAAC because the policy in the waterways is that ISFs should be living there prior to the census. Probably, most of them will not be able to show documents prior to the NHA census.
- The agencies stressed that the ISF will undergo the disqualification/qualification process.

- We, therefore, need to discuss the entitlements for those ISF who will be disqualified.

- MGA added if there will be one or 3 families that are not interested to relocate, automatically they will be subjected to COC. One resistant family or 100 families will undertake the same process. We want to avoid any precedence in the future (in accommodating ISFs). There is no need to create another policy, when we already have one that we need to implement.

Communications and Group Messaging

- MD informed the body that DPWH have regularly provided letters and other invitations forwarded to USO.
- MGA pointed out that they received on April 20, 2022 the invitations dated 2021. There might be a concern at the records section of Manila City Hall.
- CI re-affirmed that all communications will be forwarded to the mayor and attention USO.
- As agreed in the LIAC, all communications are centralized to USO or NHA and distributed to other members. So, there will be no overlapping in schedules.
- Creation of a group chat was also suggested.

- JPS further added that the group's current practice is that invitation/communications are forwarded to the Mayor's Office and a photo forwarded to other offices.

Conduct of BSAAC after RRAP Workshop

- LE suggested tackling the BSAAC after the RRAP Workshop. She stressed that the team cannot proceed with BSAAC without undergoing RRAP.
- LE added that at the meantime, the team would not adopt the DPWH census (masterlist) but the census done by LIAC NHA for relocation.
- Batch 1 and 2 are all in the NHA masterlist.

Concerns at the Relocation Site

A. Relocation Action Center (RAC)

- Set up the RAC with the suggestion of changing the name from Ready Action Center to Relocation Action Center for the help desk.
- For the shirt, this can be retained as the agency has the freedom to create their own name as a group.

B. Possible Use of Activity for Campaign of Candidates

- There will be a possibility that electoral candidates will campaign.




- Whom has the capacity to stop the election campaign in the event for as long as there is no official invitation from our end.

C. Food Packs

- The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) are not providing food packs at this time due to election ban. BGDF suggested to request from Caritas Manila for Food Packs if needed.
- ISFs will be provided with funds for their food/meal for 14 days according to LE as she reiterated that this project has the most responsible entitlements for the ISFs.

Demolition

- NHA emphasized that the group (DPWH/DOWHA) will be able to ensure that there will be no problem by organizing early on the trucks, vans, and demolition team, even the trip schedule and provider.
- NHA also emphasized that they can also facilitate demolition if funds are downloaded to their agency.
- LE suggested that before April 29, 2022, the group should ensure that there is a ready demolition team, trucks, and vans for the relocation.



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

The said approach was identified as one of the "strengths" because their commitment is vital for the restoration of their livelihood once relocated. However, as mentioned above, the survey was conducted in 2017, which is already outdated in terms of their profile and change of priorities, also identified as "weaknesses".</p>	

	<p>Given the “strengths” and “weaknesses”, the Team was able to identify the opportunities that will support and eventually fulfil the program’s objective in restoring the livelihood of PAPs, which they may consider and accept. Moreover, the assistance and support of Local Government Unit (LGU)-Trece Martires, Cavite together with Public Employment Service Office (PESO) in job referrals and placement were significantly important. 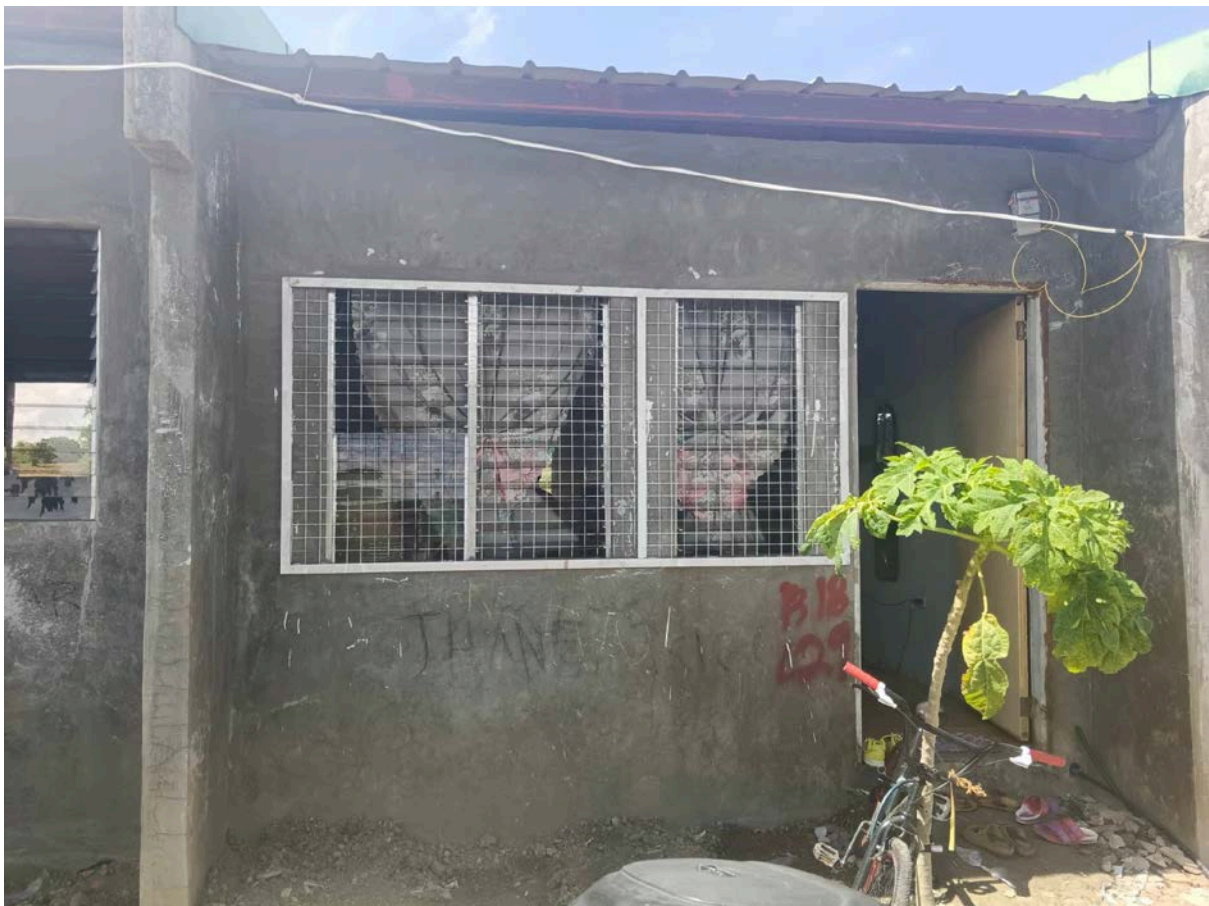
